

Global human security course7 in leading postgraduate school (2013/10/10, 17)

Venue: Lecture room, Leading postgraduate school (Sendai)

Topics: Disaster medical management, Andragogy and practical curriculum planning

On Oct 10th and 17th, Prof. Egawa conducted the lecture and workshop for practical curriculum planning about disaster medical response and evacuation center management.

The lecture focused on the andragogy concept that is incorporated in the training course of medical mentors for junior residents in Japan. Learning process prompted by needs and demands consists of objects, learning strategies and evaluation was presented. The educational terms of general instructional objectives, specific behavioral objectives, learning strategy and evaluation was provided. The learners are required to join the curriculum planning and to realize the main players of learning are themselves.

Workshop focused on the HUG game as a role playing strategy with simulative assumption of disaster. The learners experienced the effectiveness and limitation of this strategy by actively involved in game. Team building process through ice break and active involvement made the players vigorously thinking how to manage the evacuation center after large scale disaster. Learners had their own experience in Great East Japan Earthquake and produced original style of management. The aim of this course to be able to explain learning strategy and to be able to perform HUG was accomplished.
